This Thursday night, join me and The Bare Square team for a New York City opening at the George Billis Gallery featuring the work of artist Tim Saternow.

Tim Saternow is a New York-based artist whose striking urban landscape paintings of our beloved New York City are not to be missed. Saternow's works are soft yet gritty and truly beautiful. Using watercolor, he explores rust and industrial environments, often focusing on Manhattan's west side, capturing the beauty and spirit of areas before they are, in his words, "improved" out of existence.

"Tim Saternow's highly emotive, graphic watercolor cityscapes speak to the industrial past of a city which is continually going through renaissances. He reminds us of our gritty past before we completely replace it with towers of glass," says the George Billis Gallery website.
